

- The Warden system includes the Chief Warden who is responsible for management of the warden system, for each zone there are a Primary Warden and Secondary Warden

Long Weekend in Oman

Our family recently spent a long weekend in Oman. Now I know many of you who have been on this expat circuit for some time have lived there... you can skip this article.. this is not for you, you know all that I am about to share.. or you can read it and reminisce about the good times you had there – there must have been many!

Oman is a beautiful country. Upon driving from the airport to the Shangri-La hotel, our first stop, we immediately noticed two things – it is VERY clean and well kept and people are very friendly. I think our taxi driver was sad that I was too tired to engage in much discussion. But he offered to make stops for us and pulled over and let us admire the view as we drove along the high cliffs that overlooked the sea.

With two children the Shangril-La was an excellent place to stay (albeit expensive)! There are so many activities to keep everyone in the family happy. Pools, a lazy river, a beach (that is clean and in November the water a perfect temperature), there are kayaks to use for free and many other water activities you could do for a fee as well as a tennis court. There is also a kids club for 7 - 12 + that is basically a huge indoor climbing frame with slides etc.. and your typical kids club for the wee ones. There is a spa on site! We were all very relaxed here!

During our stay we went out on a boat with a local guide to fish and snorkel. We brought back two tuna that we enjoyed for dinner that night!

After this we ventured out to the desert for a night in a "desert camp". The drive out was about 3 hours – and very easy – the highways are very new, very clean and with little traffic (and the drivers that are on the road were very safe). Only for the last bit did we have to drive off-road through the sand. However, you can hire a driver for this if you prefer. There are many desert camps to choose from that all offer the typical desert activities – sand bashing, sand boarding, camel riding etc.. We arrived just in time to watch the sunset from atop a huge sand dune!

On our way back to Muscat we stopped and hiked Wadi Shab. Hiking the wadis (dry riverbeds) seems to be a past time in Oman. We were rewarded at the end with a natural pool to swim in, cliffs to jump off and even, after swimming through a small crevice, a waterfall!

We only spent one day in the city of Muscat during which we visited the Souk , which has much more traditional goods and souvenirs then the souk here in Kuwait. We also visited one museum, there are many others, we will have to do those on our next trip! We also must return for the (mountain) hiking and biking, scuba diving and many other activities we could not fit into one weekend!

All in all Oman was an excellent long weekend away – a short and direct flight from Kuwait with so many options of things to do. It is a bit on the expensive side but that seems to be common for Middle East destinations. We recommend it for sure!



Butter Prawns By Zida Zainal



Ingredients; 600g large fresh prawns (de-veined but tail on) 1 egg 2-3tbls butter 2 red chillies, sliced 10-15 curry leaves 3 cloves garlic, minced 170g evaporated milk 1 cup grated coconut, dry-fried until golden brown 1tbls sugar oil to fry the prawns salt to taste

Method;

1. Fry the prawns in hot oil until golden brown, about 3 min. Remove from the oil and set aside to drain.

2. Melt the butter in the pan and sauté the chillies, curry leaves and minced garlic for about 2 min.

3. Add evaporated milk. After 2 min, add the egg and make sure to stir so the eggs wont curdle too much.

4. Add the prawns, grated coconut and sugar and stir-fry briskly over high heat for 1-2 min. Season taste. Serve immediately.

The tour guides explained about the fascinating collection of over thirty thousand items collected over the the last fifty years. It is divided into 2 parts. Area A has exhibits like calligraphy, manuscripts, miniatures, ceramics, carvings, etc. Area B contains objects produced in the Islamic world during the last 250 years (costumes, jewelry, textiles and musical instruments). It gave us a lot of insight about Islamic tradition and culture.

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Al Shaheed park, located on the periphery of Kuwait City, narrates the story of a land, it's history and culture. The park consists of 200,000 m2 of greenery, two museums - Thekra & the Habitat, a visitor center, a lake, walkways and jogging tracks, making it the largest urban park in Kuwait.

Phase 2 has many interesting features such as maps of old and modern Kuwait, the fog and star fountain, the plaza tunnel (that leads to the fountain wall), the amphitheater and the palm tree forest.
